Frequently Asked Questions IL Alive at 25 class

How long does the course take and what is it like?

National Safety Council (NSC) will present its Alive at 25 Driver Safety Course in one four-hour session.

Alive at 25 Driver Safety Course is a highly interactive four-hour intervention program that zeroes in on drivers ages 16 to 25 — the group most likely to be involved in a fatal collision. Alive at 25 Driver Safety Course uses workbook exercises, group discussions, role-playing and short lectures to help keep young drivers safe on the road.

What does the course cost?

Drivers taking this course will be charged \$40.00.

Please be advised that National Safety Council is not responsible for drivers taking the incorrect class. Drivers will not be given a refund after the class has been completed. Please be sure you know exactly what class is required before you continue the registration process.

In addition, your class is not considered complete until your class fees are paid in full.

Is the Program mandatory?

Drivers can be mandated by a specific court to complete the Alive at 25 class.

How will I know if I am required to complete this course?

If you are being required by a specific court, the court will notify you of your need to attend.

When and where will the course be taught?

National Safety Council has a listing of many different locations throughout Illinois. The four-hour course is taught on weeknights and Saturdays, depending on the location.

Will there be a test at the end of the course?

There is no test and your completion will not be transmitted to IL Secretary of State. If you are taking the course for a court requirement, you will receive a certificate of completion that you will have to return to the court.

May I bring anyone with me to class?

No. Only students with special needs may attend class with a family member or friend who is of legal driving age. Please notify National Safety Council before your class if you need such assistance.

How can I register for this course?

Students may either [register online](#) or may call into National Safety Council at (800) 822-7009 Monday through Friday 7:00 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. CST, Saturday 7:00 am - 1:00 p.m. CST.

What do I need to bring to class with me?

Students will need to bring some form of identification, such as their driver's license, permit, school ID, birth certificate etc., confirmation notice, and a pen or a pencil.

No student will be admitted to the class without an email/mail registration confirmation or confirmation number.

What if I have special needs such as physical, language, etc.?

Drivers requiring special assistance are welcome to bring along a friend or family member to provide support during the class. Please notify National Safety Council of your intentions so we can plan for your comfort. Please note: The support person must be of legal driving age.

What happens if there is a weather related cancellation?

In the event of a weather related cancellation, National Safety Council (NSC) will attempt to contact you at the daytime telephone number provided during the registration process. If you are unsure about a weather related cancellation, please contact the program services staff at (800) 822-7009 Monday through Friday 7:00 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. CST, Saturday 7:00 am - 1:00 p.m. CST. NSC will work with the instructor, facility and students to get the class rescheduled to a new date and time. If you feel it is unsafe for you to travel to your scheduled class due to weather, please contact our office.

What if I no longer live in the state of Illinois, but still have to take the class? Can I take it in a different state?

You will need to contact the court that required you to complete the course to inform them that you no longer reside in the state of Illinois. They will give you further direction.

Rules of Operation and Conduct Policy

A student may be dismissed or barred from the class for tardiness; intoxication; consumption of controlled substances on the premises; rudeness; vulgar or disruptive behavior; carry firearms or smoking in the classroom or building; or for inattentiveness such as sleeping, cell phone usage, reading materials, not contained in the course instruction, etc. during the class. Students dismissed for violating rules of conduct may be readmitted at the discretion of the National Safety Council and the IL Secretary of State.

Cancellation/Re-registration Policy

In order to reschedule with no additional cost, students must contact National Safety Council at (800) 822-7009 during regular business hours at least 24 hours prior to the start time of the scheduled class. Should a student fail to call in advance to reschedule or fail to appear at the scheduled class, they will be charged a re-registration fee of \$40. Once registered all fees are non-refundable.
