

NSC Safety Perception Survey

This report provides results of the NSC EMPLOYEE SAFETY PERCEPTION SURVEY that was conducted at Grapevine, TX through the Navigator interface.

Employees who participated in the NSC EMPLOYEE SAFETY PERCEPTION SURVEY were asked to indicate their level of agreement with a variety of safety and work-related statements. Your location's responses were compared with responses from over 500 participating organizations in the National Safety Council (NSC) Database in order to produce comparative percentile values. Percentile scores calculated from this comparison are shown in figure below. A percentile score expresses the percentage of Database companies with a lower average response score than yours. Possible percentile scores range from 0 to 100, with 0 representing the lowest score in the Database and 100 representing the highest. For example, a percentile score of 100 indicates that all of the 500 establishments in the NSC Database received a lower average response score than your location. A percentile score of 50 indicates that half (or 250) of the 500 establishments were lower than your location.

Components with the highest average response scores do not necessarily have the highest percentile scores. Since some statements tend to be answered more positively or negatively than others, comparing results against the NSC Database automatically adjusts for the varying difficulty of the various survey statements.

Components in the figure below are listed in order of decreasing percentile score. At the top of the table are components that are more highly ranked among employee responses compared with other establishments' responses. Components at the bottom of the table are those that were evaluated less positively compared with responses from other establishments. Components with identical percentile scores are ordered by average response scores from best to worst.
