Carrier Caddle Captures Million Mile Award Celebrations abound in New Bern

New Bern, NC, Letter Carrier John Caddle III is Mid-Carolina District's most recent recipient of the National Safety Council's Million Mile Award. This award represents three decades of safe driving – which translates to at least 1 million miles – without incurring a preventable motor vehicle accident.

District Manager Angela Curtis presented Caddle with the award plaque and pin, along with a congratulatory letter. "It takes many years of diligent service to earn this award," said Curtis. "Delivering mail in a coastal city can be difficult. You safely delivered mail when weather conditions were challenging and I commend you for your diligence."

Caddle, wearing a long-sleeved uniform shirt and necktie, says he prefers to look professional when delivering mail on the route. "I interact with customers all day long," said Caddle. "A polished appearance instills confidence with the public."
