2009-2010 U.S. Postal Service Safe Driver Award Program Contract Renewal

The U.S. Postal Service has renewed its agreement for the Safe Driver Award Program. The new agreement is valid September 2009 through September 2010.

In an effort to recognize safe driving performance and prevent unintentional injury and illness in the U.S. Postal Service, the National Safety Council and the U.S. Postal Service Headquarters in Washington, D.C. have established this agreement which extends the benefits of the Safe Driver Award Program to all U.S. Postal Service facilities with driving employees. Eligible postal employee participants include those who have a normal daily assignment which involves the driving of a motor vehicle for official office business, and who have not had their driving privilege revoked or suspended.

The USPS Safe Driver program allows your facility to enroll in the Safe Driver Award Program and order a selection of program components free of charge. <u>The National Safety Council bills all costs for Safe Driver program components covered under the agreement directly to the Washington, D.C. U.S. Postal Service Headquarters Office.</u>

We encourage you take advantage of this outstanding opportunity. The enclosed packet includes a USPS Safe Driver Award Rules Booklet, an overview of program components covered under the U.S. Postal Service contract, a certification statement, and new component order forms. Please note that program components not covered under the U.S. Postal Service agreement can be purchased separately for a nominal fee.
