United States Postal Service Agreement With the National Safety Council

Effective until September 2010

The United States Postal Service and the National Safety Council have teamed up to promote and ensure the safety and health of the USPS workforce nationwide. As a long-standing member of the National Safety Council, the United States Postal Service Headquarters in Washington, D.C. has established an agreement with the Council that entitles all facilities to take advantage of member benefits in an effort to prevent unintentional injury and illness. Not only are all facilities eligible to participate in the Safe Driver Award Program, but they become full-fledged members and can receive member benefits available through the Council. Membership dues are covered under the agreement and are reconciled by the USPS Washington Headquarters. Individual facilities may choose to purchase items with associated fees that are not covered by the agreement. Such fees are the responsibility of the individual facility. Eligible postal employee participants of the Safe Driver Award Program include those who have a normal daily assignment that involves the driving of a motor vehicle for official business use, and who have not had their driving privilege revoked or suspended.
