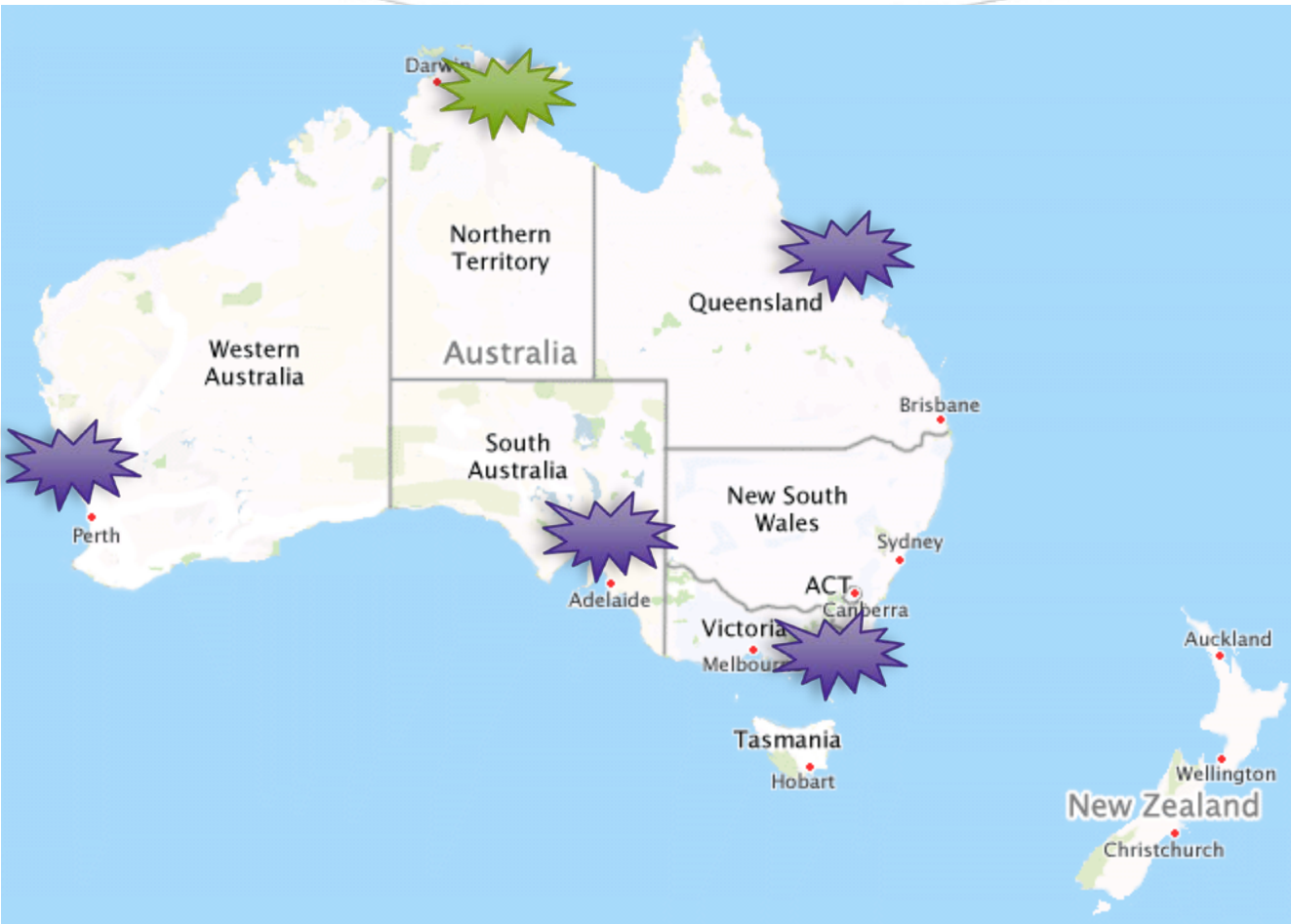

- ◆ Not compulsory part of the Certificate of Education
- ◆ Paid for by sponsors



Pacific / Australian Safe Community Designation

Pacific/Australian Safe Community Designation is a national standard which a community can apply for.

To reach this national standard the community must prove that it has met each of the indicators for Pacific/Australian Safe Community Designation.

- ◆ Leadership and Collaboration
- ◆ Program Reach
- ◆ Priority Setting
- ◆ Data Analysis and Strategic Alignment
- ◆ Evaluation
- ◆ Demonstration of Communication and Networking
