Janet Froetscher is president and CEO of the National Safety Council. Prior to joining NSC, Ms. Froetscher served as CEO of the United Way of Metropolitan Chicago from 2003 to 2008, chief operating officer of the Aspen Institute from 2000 to 2003, executive director of the Finance Research and Advisory Committee of the Civic Committee of the Commercial Club of Chicago from 1992 to 2000 and vice president of Bankers Trust Co. from 1987 to 1991. She also is co-founder of Executive Options, a staffing solutions firm based in Skokie, IL. Ms. Froetscher holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Virginia and a Master of Management degree from the Kellogg Graduate School of Management at Northwestern University. She is a board member of the Chicago Board of Options Exchange and Chicago Chamber of Commerce, and a member of the Chicago Network, Commercial Club of Chicago and Economic Club of Chicago. Ms. Froetscher also is a Henry Crown Fellow of the Aspen Institute.

John Ulczycki leads the National Safety Council's research, communications, government affairs and volunteer initiatives. Mr. Ulczycki also leads NSC's goal to save an additional 10,000 lives and prevent 1 million injuries over the next five years. He joined NSC after a 20-year career in corporate public affairs. Previous roles at NSC have included leadership of communications and public affairs, transportation safety and NSC's Air Bag and Seat Belt Safety Campaign, which took "Click it or Ticket" from a one-state pilot project to a 50-state national program that has saved nearly 200,000 lives since its inception in 1996. In October 2008, Mr. Ulczycki was host of the first International Symposium on Distracted Driving, which documented the science of cell phone use while driving. He also is an advocate for Graduated Driver Licensing legislation for teens and in 2007 hosted an International Symposium on Graduated Driver Licensing.
