## NHTSA Report sheds light on economic cost

Motor vehicle crashes cost Americans \$871 billion in economic loss and societal harm in 2010, according to a new [study](#) from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

That price tag includes \$594 billion tied to loss of life and pain and decreased quality of life due to injuries. It also accounts for \$277 billion in economic costs such as productivity loss, property damage, and medical and legal costs - nearly \$900 per U.S. resident.

Among the findings, cell phone use is now estimated to be involved in 26 percent of all motor vehicle crashes - up from the previous year. An estimated 5 percent of crashes involve texting, while 21 percent involve drivers talking on handheld or hands-free cell phones. Both of these numbers represent an increase over the prior year.
