

Eliminating Preventable Deaths Public Opinion Poll May, 2019

Objective

The overall objective of this research is to provide the National Safety Council with an understanding of public perceptions of the importance and impact of accidental or preventable deaths compared to those of other causes of death and injury.

Methodology

This research was conducted with Toluna Group's proprietary panel of pre-screened, validated, de-duplicated and well-profiled respondents. Sample outgo (invitations) and completes were monitored and weighted to ensure returns were balanced to US Census for age, gender, geographic region, income, and ethnicity.

To qualify for the study, respondents had to:

- Live in the United States
- Be 18 or older


A total of 2,000 surveys were completed from April 30th to May 9th, 2019.

Statistical significance is not shown in this report, but at the 95% confidence level +/- 2% is considered significant.




1. Where do you feel safest from risks of accidental injury?




2. Where do you feel safest from risks of accidental death?

4. When you hear "accidental death" what do you think of? (SELECT ALL THAT APPLY)






6. Which of the following do you feel it is most important to try to prevent?



7. The best ways to eliminate accidental deaths is through...? (SELECT ALL THAT APPLY)




8. Who should play the biggest role in eliminating/preventing accidental deaths?




9. Who is most often to blame when there is an accidental death caused by opioid overdose?




10. Who is most often to blame when there is an accidental death caused by car crash?



11. Who is most often to blame when there is an accidental death in the workplace?




12. What price would you be willing to pay to eliminate (reduce, lower) accidental death?



13. Has someone you personally know or love been killed accidentally?










19. How concerned are you about the following in terms of risk to you and those you care about? (% Very/Somewhat Concerned)










25. Which of the following best represents your attitude toward technology that can improve safety in the workplace?






